#### GUIDELINES FOR THE AUTHORS

The CPLF Council will examine the anonymous texts according to the following criteria:

- The proposed texts will have between 5,000 and 15,000 signs (including spaces) and have to be sent to the CPLF Council before the 28 February 2021 with a 4 to 6-line summary and 3 to 6 keywords.

- The rare bibliographical notes should only be inserted in the body of the text.

- Their content must be directly linked to the theoretical and clinical axes developed by the main lectures in order to contribute to the debates during the Congress.

- Their style and writing will also be taken into account in case of publication.

- Authors are recommended to respect the anonymity of the texts by avoiding quoting their own work.

- The editorial constraints and the number of pages set by the publisher for this volume are taken into account in the Council's choices.

The CPLF Council is available to the authors for more informations.

- Oral communications: When they come from the audience, they should not exceed three minutes. In order to support them, the number of discussants in the forum has been reduced.

- Articles for the Revue française de psychanalyse (French Psychoanalytical Journal) : After the Congress, the Rfp will write its special edition. Proposals for articles should be sent before the 15th of June 2021 to Philippe Bonilo, editor at [rfpsy@spp.asso.fr](mailto:rfpsy@spp.asso.fr)

Calibration is limited to 15,000 characters (spaces, notes, bibliographic references, self-presentation, abstract - 500 characters - and keywords - 5 - included).

Bibliographic references must be presented in short form in body text (author's name, year of publication, page) and in full at the end of the article.

In order to submit an article that meets the editorial standards of the Rfp, it is strongly recommended to read the guidelines for the authors.
